SECOND AMENDED STANDING ORDER

Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 636(b)(1)(A) and 636(b)(1)(B), it is hereby ORDERED that

all future criminal actions filed in this Court will be automatically assigned to the appropriate

United States Magistrate Judge for the purpose of doing all things proper to hear and

determine or make recommendations for disposition of any pretrial non-dispositive

motions, excluding motions in limine. The magistrate judge may, without limitation,

conduct hearings on the motions, if necessary, and enter into the record a written order

setting forth the disposition of the motions or recommendation for disposition, as the case

may be. Referrals shall be made by the Clerk's office on case opening as follows:

1. All Clarksburg and Elkins point of holding court criminal cases shall be

assigned to Magistrate Judge Michael John Aloi;

2. All Martinsburg point of holding court criminal cases shall be assigned to

Magistrate Judge Robert W. Trumble; and

3. All Wheeling point of holding court criminal cases shall be assigned to

Magistrate Judge James P. Mazzone.

If conflicts or unusual circumstances arise in any matter assigned to any magistrate judge, the district judge to whom the case is assigned or, in his or her absence, the chief judge will evaluate the assignment and, if necessary, reassign the matter to the appropriate magistrate judge and advise the Clerk's office accordingly.
